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## Town Manager's Report

Dear Board Members:

I am pleased to report the following updates from Town Hall and throughout Town:

- A reminder that we'll host a Special Town Meeting tomorrow at 7 PM at Tyngsborough Elementary School. We had a very well-attended Pre-Town Meeting Information Session last week with some great questions. There are only eight articles and all of the information you could want about the warrant can be found at [tyngsboroughma.gov](http://tyngsboroughma.gov).
- Early voting for the November 5<sup>th</sup> Presidential Election began over the weekend. On the first day of early voting, 133 residents voted at Town Hall. Additionally, the Town Clerk's Office has received more than 1000 ballots by mail from registered voters. Residents can continue to vote early at Town Hall through October 31<sup>st</sup>. - Bids are out as we speak for the construction of the DPW Garage. We released the Invitation to Bid last week and are holding a pre-bid walkthrough on Wednesday at 10 AM and the deadline for submissions is November 6th.
- The Sustainability Committee will host Zero Waste Day on November 2, 2024 at Tyngsborough Elementary School from 9 AM to 12 PM.
- The Tyngsborough Health Department will host a Flu & COVID Vaccine Clinic at Town Hall on October 28, 2024 from 10 AM to 2 PM. The clinic is open to the public and residents interested should sign up beforehand but walk-ins are welcome.
- We've been working with the Health Department and Republic Services to identify ways to improve their service delivery in Tyngsborough. One of the ideas that we're seriously exploring is cleaning up our recycling schedule so that pick up each week will focus on one side of the bridge. For instance, A week would be all on the east side and B week would be on the west side. The split of residential units per side is almost perfectly even and we all think that this will create tremendous efficiencies and reduce missed pick ups. We're targeting a January 2025 start and if we decide to move forward will announce the change in early November. Our outreach efforts will include a postcard mailed directly to every resident on our trash service.
